DIPLOMA CASES

- The first years have the opportunity to create 100 diploma cases for the graduating year. The seven of us had the opportunity to work in production a production line. We figured out the estimated cost and timeline of the project to provide a quote to our client and organized labor to produce the most effective outcome.
- Bookcloth over 98pt boards, the NBSS logo foil stamped on the cover, thin black ribbons adhered on the four corners of the museum board for the diploma pad.
- The first years also had the opportunity to create a customized diploma case for their respective graduating second-year mentors.

BOOKMARKS

- 150 handmade bookmarks for the 2017 Annual Celebration of Craft, Student & Alumni Exhibition Dinner.
- Designed the layout of the text and logo of one side of the bookmark printed on Mohawk Superfine
- A team of three, we used our own handmade marbled paper and the text printed on Mohawk, and adhered them to either side of a 20pt board with Fusion 4000. Trimmed using the board shear.
